## **Vision/Mission/Goals**

### **Vision**

The Sacramento Sheriff's Reentry Council (SRC) will develop strategies that create a pathway for the successful community reentry and reintegration of offenders while incarcerated and upon release.

### **Mission**

The primary mission of the Sacramento Sheriff's Reentry Council is to cultivate safer communities by providing appropriate services to the offender population in order to reduce recidivism and afford individual self-sufficiency. The services will begin with addressing the core causes that drive the offenders' destructive thinking by utilizing evidence-based practices and transformative programming.

### **Goals**

The goals are to provide services for the offender population that address:

- Accountability
- Public safety
- Substance abuse treatment
- Core causes of destructive behaviors
- Transformative programming
- Transitional and permanent housing
- Transportation
- Health
- Vocational training and education
- Employment
- Financial independence
- Strengthening families and the community.

Incarcerated offenders released into Sacramento County communities will participate in an integrated and supportive network comprised of community and faith-based organizations, government and public agencies and the broader community.

### **Standing Committees**

- Steering Committee
  - Comprised of one member from each standing committee who will be the voting members for establishing policy and procedures.
  - The hub through which information will be exchanged through the SRC.
  - Produce/develop the reentry plan.

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- Program & Resource Development Committee
  - Provide resource development.
  - Inventory of current programs and services.
  - Identify best practices.
  - Conduct research.
  - Prepare gaps/needs/assets analysis.
  - Provide data collection.
  
- Process & Assessment Committee
  - Work to build the mechanism for the reentry process for offenders released from incarceration.
  - Create links between state and county agencies and community and faith based organizations.
  
- Community Outreach and Awareness Committee
  - Develop a communication plan, frequently asked questions, and talking points to maintain continuity in the message.
  
- Measures & Outcomes Committee
  - Determine and collect data/statistics that will provide information on offender recidivism, program participation, measures of success/failure and other outcome measures.
  
- Funding Committee
  - Seek out and coordinate funding opportunities
  - Write and assist in submission of funding opportunities.
  - Develop program funding sustainability.
